## Approach:

Choose a discussion group within the evenings theme

Introductions - include what you want to achieve/why

<u>Visioning</u> - what are key elements of that steady state, 'ideal' world within this topic?

Back-casting - how do we connect BAU with that future imagined state?

<u>Designing transitional states</u> - that accommodate/challenge the full spectrum of human personality, condition and aspiration

- Choose an activity/enterprise/business that is standard BAU practice unlikely sustainable
- What can these skills/technologies/materials be transformed to that will contribute to sustainable, life-affirming (kind), enriching enterprises? These may be termed strongly sustainable futures (SSF)
- Describe the sequence of intermediate adaptations/stepping stones/transitional states that connect BAU to SSF with least possible disruption or trauma (ecologically, psycho-socioculturally, and economically)

**Reality Check/Disclaimer:** We don't intend to solve all the world's problems overnight, nor are we oblivious to global academic/political dialogue. But urgency increases
